This class is for all levels of irrigation experience, including landscape and irrigation designers and contractors, landscape architects, urban planners, and facility managers.
Thur., April 1 9:00 am – 4:00 pm	<b><i>Spanish Language</i> System Maintenance, Repair and Scheduling</b> <i>Free</i>	Learn how to maintain, repair and schedule automatic irrigation systems to keep them watering efficiently. Includes hands-on activities. Taught completely in Spanish by expert instructors with real-life experience. Includes Spanish handouts.
Thur., April 1 9:00 am – 4:00 pm	<b>Site Water Management Planning</b> <i>Free</i>  <b>Certified Site Water Planner Exam</b> will be offered within 30 days of the class by the Irrigation Water Management Society (IWMS). Exam date & location to be announced at the class.	This is a high-level course on how to develop an efficient site water management plan with acceptable return on investment. Class covers: developing a site profile; analyzing historical water use; working with site water budgets; identifying conservation measures; return on investment (ROI) analysis of conservation measures, and preparing report documents. Class includes textbook and planning spreadsheet software.
